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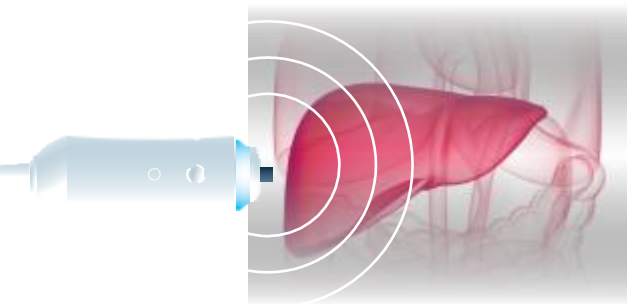

What is FibroScan?

An examination with FibroScan, which uses a technology called Vibration Controlled Transient Elastography (VCTE™), is a non-invasive test used to assess liver stiffness.

FibroScan is indicated for noninvasive measurement of shear wave speed and equivalent stiffness in the liver. The shear wave speed or stiffness may be used as an aid to clinical management of your liver disease.

The result shows the evolution of the health of your liver.



FIBROSCAN MEASURES LIVER STIFFNESS.

The FibroScan examination is painless, quick and easy. During measurement, you feel a slight vibration on the skin at the tip of the probe.

What does the FibroScan examination consist of?

You lie on your back, with your right arm raised behind your head. Your technician or nurse applies a water-based gel to the skin and places the probe against your skin with a slight pressure.

The examination includes 10 consecutive measurements made at the same location.

The result of the test is delivered to your physician for interpretation.

Can I eat prior to the test?

You should not eat within 2 or 3 hours of the FibroScan test.

The FibroScan test is performed on your right side under your arm at the level of your breast bone. Patients should wear a blouse or shirt which can be partially unbuttoned to expose their right side above the waist and below the breast bone.

How long is the test?

The test lasts approximately 15-20 minutes.
