### Overview

On January 19, 2017, the Office of the Federal Register published a revised [Federal Policy for the Protection of Human Subjects](#), marking the first significant changes to the Federal Policy for the Protection of Human Subjects, or "Common Rule," since 1991. These changes will have important and wide-reaching implications for the human subjects research enterprise.
