

Night Medicine Curriculum

First year residents assigned to the Night Medicine Service are expected to complete this curriculum while on service. The resident should complete the assigned readings, and then complete the assigned objectives. The completed objectives will be reviewed and graded by a faculty physician, and included in the resident's portfolio and reviewed at the resident's evaluation.

This comprises the didactic component of the night medicine rotation, and completion of this curriculum is essential. The readings that are included are considered fundamental to the successful performance of clinical duties when providing care to adults on a general medicine service at night. On completion of the readings, residents must complete the assigned objectives to complete the curriculum.
