

RESIDENT GRAND ROUNDS

The resident must conduct and present a scholarly review of a medical topic. An acceptable review is a comprehensive and critical assessment of the available published data. The goal of the review is to present the “state of the art” of some important issue or practice.

Protocol:

1. A topic must be selected at least 3 months in advance of the scheduled conference, and must be approved by the Program Director.
2. The resident should select an advisor who is knowledgeable in the Grand Rounds subject area and must meet with this advisor to review planned presentation content.
3. A thorough outline with basic references should be reviewed with the advisor no later than one month prior.
4. Residents must produce the *PowerPoint* slides to be used in their Grand Rounds presentation.
5. Residents will be required to present (live or via videotape) their Grand Rounds presentation to Bea Martin at least 2 weeks prior to discuss ways to improve their public speaking skills.
6. The presentation must be accompanied by a comprehensive handout with complete references.
7. The presentation should last no longer than 50 minutes to allow adequate time for questions.
8. The faculty will decide if the Resident Grand Rounds was satisfactory in meeting the scholarship requirement. If the presentation is not judged satisfactory, it will need to be repeated.
