Tools Offered	Freedom from Smoking, Smoking Cessation Program- Freedom from Smoking is led by a trained facilitator and includes eight, in-person group sessions over a seven-week timespan. This program features a step-by-step plan to help tobacco users gain control over their behavior and quit smoking.

Summary of Activity	<p>To date, 16 individuals have participated in the Freedom from Smoking program. Five participants have quite smoking as a result of the program, nine participants have reduced tobacco usage, and five continued previous smoking habits. 100% will receive a 3- and 6-month follow-up survey to ensure program effectiveness and assist clients with accessing additional resources, if needed. (To date, 2 African American, 14 Caucasian, 8 Female, 8 Male served)</p> <p>In addition, Freedom From Smoking was provided to three students under age 18 from Pekin Community Highschool. Each student played sports and was pentalized for vaping. They had to complete a nicotine cessation program to have eligibility to return.</p>	
Effectiveness (Value, Lessons Learned, Recommendations for Improvements)	<p>Out of the 12 completed participants, 5 participants have quit smoking as a result of program participation; however the one participant has reduce tobacco usage.</p>

Summary of Activity	LDCT eligibility screenings event was completed on June 20, 2018 at the Hult Center for Healthy Living's monthly Seniors on the Go program, which was attended by 50 community adults. Six individuals participated in the LDCT eligibility screening at the event. Unfortunately, zero met the criteria for LDCT.	LDCT eligibility screenings event was completed on September 19, 2018 at the Hult Center for Healthy Living's Annual Senior Health Fair, which was attended by nearly 300 community adults. Ten individuals participated in the LDCT eligibility screening at the event. Of this, one individual was eligible and scheduled for a LDCT.
Effectiveness (Value, Lessons Learned, Recommendations for Improvements)	The value of providing the LDCT eligibility screening with a lung cancer educational presentation was high; however, anticipated participation of screening was not achieved. Recommendation for improvements would be for LDCT eligibility screening to be offered before presentation with other screening offerings, as well as after presentation to increase opportunity.	Once again, the value of providing the LDCT eligibility screening with a lung cancer education and screening information was very high; however, anticipated participation of screening was not achieved. Recommendation for improvements would be for incentive items offered to those who participate in LDCT eligibility screening.
