



## TRINITY INFUSION CENTER EXPANDED OPERATIONS

Trinity Infusion Center has expanded its operations to include extended hours and additional infusion bays in the Recovery Care Center (RCC) on the Moline, IL campus (see map). Operations in this location will be referred to as Trinity Infusion Center RCC. Current operations in the Medical Office Building (MOB), Suite 304 on the Moline, IL will remain the same. Treatments scheduled on weekend days will continue to take place in MOB, Suite 304. Total capacity of both areas has increased from 16 infusion bays to 22.

### Trinity Infusion Center RCC

- Hours of operations: Monday-Friday, 12:00 PM - 8:00 PM
- Staffed with 2 RNs
- 6 rooms total; 10 infusion bays; 4 rooms with 2 chairs and 2 rooms each with a chair or a bed
- Rooms with beds can accommodate a single patient requiring a bed **or** an infusion chair. These rooms are shared with RCC with the needs of RCC given priority.

### Trinity Infusion Center Suite 304

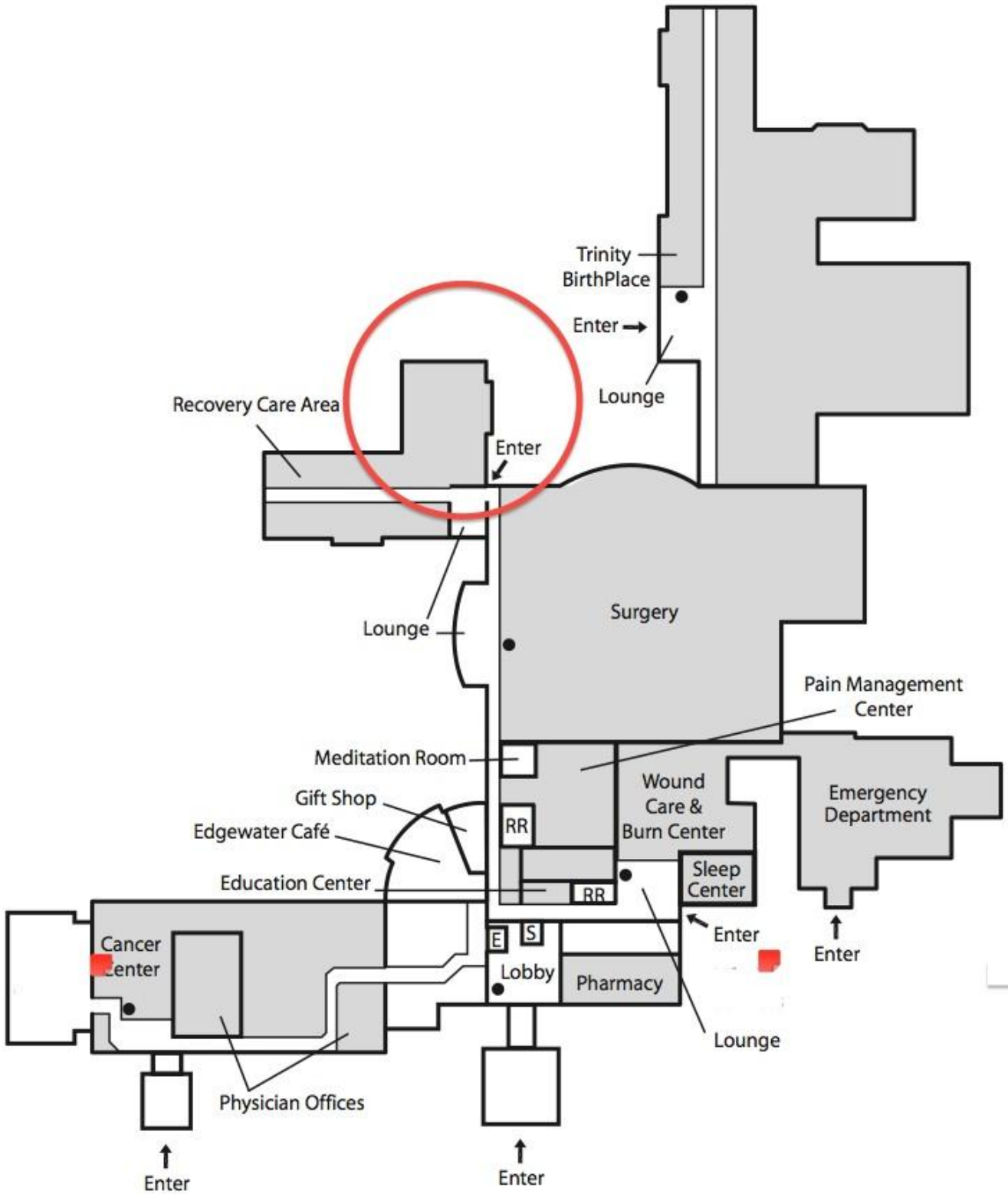
- Hours of operations: Monday-Friday, 8:00 AM - 4:30 PM
- Saturday and Sunday, 8:00 AM - 4:30 PM as needed
- Staffed with 4-5 RNs depending on need
- 12 infusion bays

### General Instructions

- Patients will be given the location of their infusion at the time the appointment is made.
- Please do not promise particular beds or locations to patients; these will be assigned based on individual needs by the Infusion Center staff.
- The efficiency and success of the infusion center is based upon the ability to start and complete treatments within established hours of operation; orders for blood transfusions that cannot be completed by 8 PM will be scheduled for the next day as appropriate with the exception of Saturday and Sunday.
- In order to maintain the schedule and to accommodate timely patient treatments, the practice of seeing and treating on the same day is problematic and should be reserved only for special circumstances (e.g. long distance traveled).
- Orders and requested supporting documentation (H&P, progress notes, labs, consents, etc.) should be faxed to the Infusion Center by 3 PM the day the referral is made.
- The practice of giving 3 units of blood in one setting is very difficult to accommodate for a variety of reasons; as a result, this is discouraged.
- The Infusion Center is designed for ambulatory outpatients and is not an extension of acute care. Please keep this in mind when evaluating your patients for care.
